

# Lesson Plan Stems for *Madama Butterfly*

How does the opera *Madama Butterfly* by Giacomo Puccini intersect with all academic content areas? Begin with a lesson plan stem and connect the opera to classroom curricula.

NOTES: Suggested grade levels are listed to the right of each lesson plan stem.

PreK = Pre-Kindergarten, ES = elementary school, MS = middle school, HS = high school

Lesson Plan Stems in the <u>English Language Arts</u> and <u>Mathematics</u> sections are *Common Core Friendly*, and are marked:



#### **Arts and Humanities**

State Standards: 9.1, 9.2, 9.3, 9.4

Cio-Cio-San hums a lullaby to Sorrow. What is a lullaby? When and why is a lullaby usually sung? Do you know any lullabies? Sing a lullaby to your classmates.

PreK

Color a picture of a kimono for Cio-Cio-San. What colors will you use?

PreK PreK

What do butterflies look like and how do they move? Make a butterfly costume. What materials and colors will you use?

Music, emotion, and movement are interconnected. Listen to the "Humming Chorus" from *Madama Butterfly*. How does the music make you feel? Practice humming a song that you know. What is the difference between humming, singing, and talking? Cover some flashlights with different colors of gels or cellophane. Listen to the "Humming Chorus" again, and project your flashlights toward the ceiling to show how you feel the music moves. What do you see? How would you describe the movement of your lights?

PreK/ES

Look at some photos of special instruments used in *Madama Butterfly:* Japanese gong, Japanese bells, and bird whistles. Can you match the sounds of these instruments to their photos?

PreK/ES

What is the Japanese art form known as origami? Practice folding paper into easy shapes and animals. Read a book about a young Japanese girl who aimed to create a thousand origami cranes: Sadako and the Thousand Paper Cranes. How does this story make you feel?

ES

Cio-Cio-San hums a lullaby to Sorrow. What is a lullaby? What is the importance of this type of music? Why did Puccini decide to start a scene in <i>Madama Butterfly</i> with a lullaby?  Design a kimono for Cio-Cio-San. Include in your design at least five items that represent who Cio-Cio-San is. What colors would you use? Write a short paragraph to explain your choices.  One of the most well-known melodies from <i>Madama Butterfly</i> is the "Humming Chorus." How difficult is it to identify a piece of music that is hummed? Identify tunes that you hum. Explore a variety of Japanese music styles. What are some traditional ES/MS
instruments? Did Puccini try to replicate any of those traditional sounds in his score to be played by a modern Western orchestra? What, if any, instruments did he use that might not be found in a Western orchestra?
How can music express certain emotions? Did Puccini use specific ES/MS instruments or musical motifs to express the emotions of his characters? How?
What is a pentatonic scale? Do you think music created with a five-note scale sounds Japanese? Listen for and identify some instances when you hear a pentatonic scale in this opera.
Geisha such as Cio-Cio-San were often practitioners of many different fine arts, sometimes including calligraphy, the art of beautiful handwriting. What is the difference between handwriting, printing, and more elaborate lettering? Practice writing with a pencil, pen, and ink brush. What color ink can be used for calligraphy?
In Japan, colors often have symbolic meaning. For example, white is used for purity, but it also symbolizes death. Sometimes brides wear white, but what is the traditional color for a Japanese bride? Red means peace and prosperity and is often used for festival decorations, but red is also used to ward off evil spirits. Look at a Japanese flag. What colors are there? Why might those colors have been chosen for a nation's flag? What do colors symbolize in the United States? What do the colors of our flag represent?
Giacomo Puccini came from a long line of family musicians. What other composers had musical ancestry? Name some composers who didn't have musical ancestry. Can you draw any conclusions based on your research?
Opera America, the national service organization for opera, lists on its website the top 10 most performed operas of each season. What other operas might appear on this list? Which operas were performed most often in 2024–2025? Why?

Madama Butterfly is through-composed. Describe the characteristics of MS/HS through-composition and compare them to those of an opera that is not through-composed. Using a recording of Madama Butterfly, identify and list examples of this technique. Compare the opera Madama Butterfly with the musical Miss Saigon. How MS/HS are the characters alike? Does the music convey the same emotions? What instruments are used in the orchestras for both pieces? What is a pentatonic scale? What kind of music has been written using this MS/HS musical device? Did Puccini use pentatonic scales in his score for *Madama* Butterfly? Play a pentatonic scale on the black keys of the piano. Create sounds for characters and play them at the same time. Do they sound good together? Play a pentatonic scale on a xylophone by removing some bars so that only C-D-E-G-A are left. How do composers and librettists collaborate? Puccini worked with two MS/HS librettists when writing Madama Butterfly. What role did each librettist play? What are some other collaborative teams involved in creating an opera? Giacomo Puccini studied composition at the Milan Conservatory from MS/HS 1880–1883. Compare a modern music conservatory curriculum with that of a conservatory during the 19<sup>th</sup> century. Explore the art of Ikebana. What are the philosophies behind this art form? MS/HS How does it relate to floristry? Design a display using the techniques of Ikebana. Where can one learn more about this tradition? Madama Butterfly was a failure at its premiere at La Scala in 1904. Why? MS/HS How did it evolve into one of the world's most-beloved operas? Critics of traditional *Madama Butterfly* productions accuse the opera HS industry of "yellow face" and cultural misappropriation. How does the coproduction from Cincinnati Opera, Pittsburgh Opera, Detroit Opera, and Utah Opera address these issues?

#### **Career Education and Work**

Puccini's father was also a musician. Do you know of anyone who does the same job as his/her mother or father? What do the adults in your family do for a living? What do you want to be when you grow up?

Cio-Cio-San is a *geisha*, which means "arts person" in Japanese. As an arts person, she would have learned how to play a musical instrument, dance, sing, and practice good conversation skills. Do you know anyone who can play an instrument, dance, or sing? How long have they been practicing their talent? How long does it take to learn a new skill from scratch? Learn a new skill with your classmates, such as a song or a dance step. How long did it take your class to acquire this new skill?

Pinkerton is a U.S. Navy officer. When a person serves in any branch of PreK/ES the military the clothes they wear on duty are called uniforms. What clothes, or uniforms would U.S. navy officers wear to work? What other jobs require a person to wear a uniform? Sometimes officers like Pinkerton are called "decorated" when they have PreK/ES medals on their uniforms. What's a medal? How might someone earn a medal? Name some military medals you've heard of. What are some medals only given to navy personnel? Are there any medals that service persons can earn, regardless of the military branch in which they serve? Puccini had a passion for fast cars and owned several as well as **ES** employing a professional driver. How does someone become a professional driver? What skills does a professional driver need to have? Are professional drivers and race car drivers the same profession? If not, where do the two professions differ? ES/MS Pinkerton and Cio-Cio-San's relationship is arranged by a marriage broker. What is a Japanese marriage broker, and how did that role compare to the job of a matchmaker? Are matchmakers still used today? If so, how has this job evolved? Are matchmakers still relevant in our digital age? In the opera, Pinkerton rents his Tokyo house from a marriage broker for a MS/HS term of 999 years. What companies or digital services do we use now for renting housing? Is a human broker still required to complete the renting process? How have digital services changed the real estate industry? Describe how a geisha is trained in modern day Japan. What subjects do MS/HS geishas learn, how long is their training, and what skills must they achieve? Describe a typical working day in the life of today's geisha. Are they respected? What characteristics of Cio-Cio-San are evidence of her geisha training? Is there a modern-day equivalent of geisha elsewhere? Pinkerton is a naval officer, and nowadays, people often enter the military MS/HS as a pathway to other careers in the private and public sectors. What training can a person receive in the military that can become a pathway to civilian jobs? What kinds of educational opportunities does military service help provide or fund? What kinds of jobs do former service members do? Are there any jobs where prior military service is required or preferred? Giacomo Puccini decided to associate his musical career with the theater MS/HS rather than the church, as his ancestors had done. Do you think Puccini's family approved of his career choice? Was this a profitable decision? Should one choose a profession solely based on money? Explore the history of the Ricordi publishing company and its relationship MS/HS to opera composers, such as Puccini. How can a publisher make or break a composer's career?

Puccini was influenced to become an opera composer by Verdi's *Aida*. Interview adults to determine if they had an "instant" recognition about a career path. Is it necessary to have a "light bulb going off" experience to decide on a personal career?

Puccini's mother wrote to Queen Margherita to obtain a scholarship for her son to study at the Milan Conservatory. What kind of income was required to send a student to study at a university in Italy during the late 19<sup>th</sup> century? What is the average cost of college tuition today?

When were trains introduced to Japan? What training and requirements does an engineer need in order to operate a train? How does this training and licensing differ from the training needed to operate an automobile?

MS/HS

Pinkerton is a lieutenant in the United States navy, and as an officer he is expected to be a leader. Investigate the leadership structures of the military, federal government, and private corporations. What management skills are needed for the top leadership roles in each? How does each leader's responsibilities differ among these groups? Do you think Pinkerton has the skills to make a good leader? Why or why not?

#### **Civics and Government**

Japan has a royal family. What does it mean if someone is royal? This family includes several princes and princesses. What is a prince and princess? What do you think they do? What other princes and princesses have you heard of?

PreK

Japan has a governing body with three branches that are similar to the three branches of the United States government. Who is the head of the government in the United States? What is that person's title?

PreK

Most countries have flags. What does the Japanese flag look like? What colors does it use? Compare the Japanese flag to the United States' flag. How are they similar or different? Pretend you have your own imaginary country. Design a flag to represent your imaginary nation. What would it look like? What colors and shapes or symbols will you have on your flag?

PreK

Madama Butterfly takes place in a port city. Have you ever been to a port or a dock? Who makes safety rules for boats? In Pittsburgh, it's common to see one of the boats of the Gateway Clipper fleet sailing up and down the three rivers. Who makes sure it is safe to be on one of the boats?

PreK/ES

The current Japanese government includes legislative, executive, and judiciary branches. What do those words mean? The Japanese Emperor is its Head of State, but he has no power. His role is ceremonial and representative. What does that mean? What is the title of the head of state in Japan who does hold power?

ES

Bicycling is an important means of transportation in Japan and is becoming more popular in the United States. As more cyclists and automobile drivers share the streets, should cyclists also be required to get a license to ride on city streets? Where may a cycling enthusiast learn the correct and current rules of the road? Should cyclists be held to the same accountability standards as motorized drivers?	ES/MS
Nagasaki, the setting of <i>Madama Butterfly</i> , is a port city in Japan. How are ports maintained in modern times? How are goods entering and leaving ports regulated? What government agencies play a role in this process?	MS/HS
In modern-day Japan, what laws or regulations govern the marketing industry? How are these regulations enforced?	MS/HS
Cio-Cio-San renounced her Buddhist religion in order to marry Pinkerton. Why was this significant? Why would that decision anger her family? How do people change religions today?	MS/HS
Imagine that the story of <i>Madama Butterfly</i> happened today and imagine that Butterfly does not die. Consider the implication of Pinkerton having two wives. What rights would Cio-Cio-San and Kate have? What laws exist to support them? Would Butterfly have claims to American citizenship? Consider the position of Kate, Pinkerton's American wife. Is her marriage to Pinkerton an act of bigamy? What rights would she have?	MS/HS
B.F. Pinkerton is a U.S. Navy Lieutenant. Research U.S. Navy ranks. Have they changed since the Navy was established by Congress in 1794? What are the roles, uniform features, and customs associated with each rank? How do U.S. Navy ranks compare with other U.S. Armed Forces?	MS/HS
The libretto of <i>Madama Butterfly</i> is based on the play <i>Madame Butterfly</i> by David Belasco. Puccini had to apply for the rights to use Belasco's play. When did copyright laws come into effect? How did the laws affect opera libretto development?	MS/HS
As cycling grows in popularity, what laws exist to accommodate non- motorized vehicles on public streets? What safety laws, measures, and protocols exist to protect cyclists and drivers? Are these measures adequate? What laws may need to be enacted?	MS/HS
Pinkerton signed a 999-year marriage contract with a monthly renewal option. Research marriage contracts of the early 20 <sup>th</sup> century and today. Explore the language of marriage contracts. Debate the implications of Pinkerton's deal with contracts of today.	HS

## **Economics**

Japan ranks third in the world for manufacturing output. Do you own any books or toys that were made in Japan? Have you seen any Japanese cartoons (anime)? Do you think it costs more to buy a toy made in a different country or made in the U.S.? Why or why not?	PreK
Both the U.S. and Japan have paper money. What is each called and what does each look like? Compare Japanese to U.S. paper money. Design your own paper money. What would you call it, and what would it look like?	PreK
Japan has a reputation for building excellent cars. Can you name some brands of Japanese cars?	PreK
Cio-Cio-San is a working mother raising her son by herself. What kinds of expenses does a single parent have? Cio-Cio-San is a professional entertainer, which means she often must work at night. How might this kind of work schedule impact her expenses, when compared to a parent who works during the day?	ES
Cio-Cio-San must support her family with just her income. What is the monthly rent for an apartment in your town? What are the utility expenses? What would it cost to feed three people for a month? Develop a reverse budget, based on these expenses. How much income would a person need to earn to support a three-person household? Keep in mind that the recommended rent-to-income ratio means that rent should be no more than 30% of a person's income. How does that recommendation impact your calculated income amount?	ES/MS
Puccini returned royalties after the disastrous premiere of <i>Madama Butterfly</i> . What are royalties and how are they calculated? To whom are they paid?	MS/HS
Pinkerton was a U.S. naval officer stationed in Japan. Who pays for U.S. military personnel stationed abroad? What is the budget allotted for maintaining U.S. service bases and personnel abroad? Does the host country also contribute to covering this expense?	MS/HS
How important is Japan to the global economy today? What economic challenges does Japan currently have, and how are they addressing these concerns? What is the state of trade between Japan and the U.S.?	MS/HS
How did the introduction of trains to Japan impact Japan's economy? How important is the railroad industry to Japan? Compare the significance of rail transportation in Japan to rail transportation in the U.S.	MS/HS
Japan first opened its society to trade with Europeans in 1543, but ended relations with the West in 1639, and remained closed until Commodore Perry forced trade to begin anew in 1854. How did this re-opening of the Far East to western countries impact western trade? How did this shift impact both local and global economies, as well as the balance of regional power?	HS

## **English Language Arts CORE**

Lesson Plan Stems in the English Language Arts section are Common Core Friendly:



Sometimes at the end of an opera like *Madama Butterfly*, the "bad guy", or villain, is booed by the audience because he/she did such a good job of playing a "bad guy". How would you feel if someone booed your work? What is appropriate theater etiquette to show artists that they've done a good job, even if their characters are villains?

PreK

Haiku is a three-line Japanese poem that follows a five-seven-five syllable format. What is a syllable? Listen while your teacher recites a haiku. Can you count the syllables in each line? How are syllables different from words? How many syllables are in your name?

PreK

The story of *Madame Butterfly* is a fictional adaptation of a different novel called *Madame Chrysanthème*, which in turn was partly based on the author's real-life experience. What is the difference between real life and fiction? How can a fictional story have some real-life parts to it? Make up a story based on an experience you've had but add some fictional elements.

PreK/ES

Look at a manga, the name for a Japanese comic book or graphic novel. Usually, the stories begin with what we think of as the back cover, and flow from top to bottom and from right to left. How is that different from the way Americans read books?

PreK/ES

Stories can be told in words, pictures, music, and by other means. Design a *Madama Butterfly* charm bracelet that tells the story of the opera. What will each of your charms look like? How many will you need to tell the story?

PreK/ES

In the opera, Cio-Cio-San hums a lullaby to Sorrow. What is a lullaby? What is the etymology (word origin) of the word "lullaby"? How might those origins foreshadow what happens to her son Sorrow? What is the plural of lullaby? What language rule applies when changing a word ending in "y" to plural?

ES

Authors choose names for their characters that will help with characterization and may also foreshadow a character's role or their fate. Consider the names Butterfly, Sorrow/ Trouble, Pinkerton, and Sharpless. How might each name help an audience understand the character and the role each one plays?

ES

Imagine you are 15 years old and forced to marry. Write a journal entry describing your feelings and reservations, if any.

ES/MS

Write a journal in the voice of either Cio-Cio-San or Pinkerton. What assumptions did each of them bring to their marriage? How did they view the other?

Explore Japanese styles of communication. How do they differ from Western styles of communication?

ES/MS

What is a haiku? What are the rules that guide haiku writing? Write a haiku that uses characters and events found in *Madama Butterfly*. Explore another form of Japanese poetry—renga. How is renga different from haiku?

ES/MS

Using words, pictures, or collage, design a graphic organizer to represent an element of fiction (setting, characters, problem, solution, author's message) of the story line of *Madama Butterfly*.

Research the meaning of some of the vocabulary used in *Madama Butterfly* and Japanese culture:

What qualities do you associate with a butterfly? Consider the anatomical characteristics of butterflies. How are these similar to Madama Butterfly's character? List the qualities of other characters. What animal would you associate with each? Explore the use of "metaphor" in the opera.

MS/HS

Consider the position of the character Kate, Pinkerton's American wife. Is her marriage to Pinkerton an act of bigamy? What rights would she have? Retell the ending of *Butterfly* from Kate's perspective. How well does she understand the nature of the man she's married? What challenges lie ahead for her and Sorrow?

MS/HS

Stage a debate over whether racism played a role in Pinkerton's attitude toward Cio-Cio-San. Was racism a factor in the internment of Japanese-Americans during World War II? What other confrontations may have racism as a factor? What can be done to foster understanding between different races and cultures?

MS/HS

Trace the story of *Madama Butterfly* to its origins as Loti's *Madame Chrysanthème*. How did the story change from Loti's original version?

### **Family and Consumer Sciences**

State Standards: 11.1, 11.2, 11.3, 11.4

Because Cio-Cio-San is a working mother, she employs Suzuki, a maid to help with the housework. Who does the housework in your home? What chores do you do to help with the household work?

PreK

In *Madama Butterfly,* Cio-Cio-San and Pinkerton come from two very different backgrounds: she is from Japan, and he is from the United States. Do you know any couples who also come from different backgrounds or different countries?

PreK

Tea is an important part of Japanese culture. Have you ever tasted tea? What is tea, and how is it made? Have your teacher prepare two different types of tea, green and black. Taste each; what does each taste like? Which do you prefer? If you tasted each while blind folded, could you tell which was green and which was black? Explain.

PreK/ES

During the "Flower Duet", Madama Butterfly and Suzuki decorate the house with flowers when they learn that Pinkerton is returning home. How do you decorate for special occasions? How do people from different cultures use flowers for special occasions, such as using marigolds for Indian weddings?

PreK/ES

Japanese people eat their food using chopsticks, called *hashi*. Have you ever eaten food with chopsticks before? Learn how to hold chopsticks, and practice eating some different kinds of food with them. Can you pick up small pieces of food with your chopsticks? One of the staples of Japanese cuisine is a sticky rice called *uruchimai* rice. How easy is it to eat rice with your chopsticks? Does using chopsticks change how you eat, or what food you might serve?

PreK/ES

In the opera, Pinkerton and Cio-Cio-San perform a marriage ceremony. What are Japanese wedding traditions? Explain the ceremony and reception. Are there specific clothes, food, music, and/or dances? Compare a traditional Japanese wedding to a typical Western wedding in the U.S.

ES

Geishas practice careful etiquette when they are entertaining. What is meant by etiquette? Why is learning good social etiquette important? What is the proper etiquette when meeting someone from Japan? From the United States?

ES

Goro is a marriage broker in *Madama Butterfly*. How do most people decide to get married today?

ES

Learn about Japanese food and tea ceremonies. Why do certain foods and tea have special significance in the Japanese culture? Learn to make a Japanese dish and eat it with chopsticks.

What is a kimono? How are kimonos worn and/or folded to represent stages of life and death? What colors are age-appropriate for kimonos? Research how social classes and occupations are represented in Japanese clothing.

ES/MS

In Act II of *Madama Butterfly*, the marriage broker Goro introduces Cio-Cio-San to Prince Yamadori in hopes that she will marry him. In what societies and cultures do families or suitors use matchmakers to find mates? Do modern-day personal ads or online dating services fulfill this role? Why or why not?

MS/HS

In the opera, Pinkerton rents his house for a term of 999 years. What is the length of a typical lease for renting a house today? How would a person go about renting a house in a foreign country? Compare rental housing in Japan to rental housing in your town. What would you need to earn in a year to afford the cost of renting a home in Tokyo or another big city?

MS/HS

After Japan's ports were reopened to the world in 1854, American and European cultures began to use a Japanese style or aesthetic in decoration, fashion, and architecture. Find pictures of these kinds of goods. Design a diorama to represent this era in decorating.

MS/HS

#### Geography

Madama Butterfly takes place in Nagasaki, Japan. Locate Japan on the globe or a world map. What is Japan surrounded by? What do we call this kind of land mass? Superimpose Japan on a U.S. map to compare how large the two countries are.

PreK

Learn the names of some famous mountains in Japan. Can you recognize Mt. Fuji in some photographs? What shape is Mt. Fuji? Do we have mountains in Pennsylvania? If so, what are some of their names?

PreK

What is the weather like in Japan? Is it similar to the weather in Pittsburgh?

PreK

Pinkerton tells Madama Butterfly that he will return when the robins nest in the spring. Learn about birds in Japan and America. Are they the same or different? Are Japanese robins the same as American robins?

PreK/ES

In many traditional productions of *Madama Butterfly*, Madama Butterfly's house has a terrace and a garden. What is a terrace? Why would someone have a terrace in the yard? Madama Butterfly and Suzuki also decorate their house with flowers. What kinds of flowers are common in Japan? If you wanted to decorate your house with flowers, what kinds of flowers would you want to use? Do these flowers grow in your garden, or do you get them from a store?

PreK/ES

Japan sometimes has earthquakes and tsunamis. What are those? Could we ever have a tsunami in Pittsburgh? Why or why not? What places in the United States might be impacted by tsunamis or earthquakes?	ES
Locate Japan on a map. How many islands make up Japan? Where is Nagasaki? Research the climate, landscape, and agriculture of that area. What are the major exports of Japan?	ES/MS
Nagasaki is a port city. Describe the geographical features that make for a good commercial trading port. What types of ports are located in Nagasaki? What tangential industries are found in port cities? What goods are transported to and from Nagasaki?	ES/MS

## Health, Safety, and Physical Education

Lieutenant Pinkerton is a naval officer, so he spends much of his time on boats. Learn how to be safe on a boat or in the water. How can you be safe when you go to the pool? What are some important skills to learn so you can play in the water safely? Who keeps you safe when you are near a pool, a lake, or the beach?

PreK

Geishas such as Cio-Cio-San are singers and dancers. Singers warm up their vocal cords before singing; dancers warm up their muscles. What are some good stretching exercises to warm up your muscles before dancing? What are some good exercises to warm up your vocal chords before singing? Practice these exercises with your classmates.

PreK

Japanese children have many traditional games, board games, card games, dice games, and word games. What are games that American children play?

PreK

Puccini wrote an "Intermezzo" in *Madama Butterfly*. An intermezzo is a short piece of music, or break, between larger sections. What does it mean when we say we are "taking a break"? Is it like recess? What other kinds of breaks do people take from school or work? Why do we need breaks?

PreK/ES

Try on a kimono and practice kneeling and rising smoothly, like Suzuki does when she's carrying a tray. Carry a tea set on a tray without tipping or jerking the tea. What muscles do you feel working to keep your balance?

PreK/ES

Suzuki insists that Butterfly rest instead of staying up late and waiting for Pinkerton. What are the benefits of a full night's sleep? What are the negative effects of sleep deprivation and fatigue? What does the medical community recommend as a full night's rest? What is the average amount of sleep American adults get each night? Create a sleep log for yourself. What is the average amount of sleep you get in one week?

ES/MS

Towards the end of the opera, flower petals are spread all over the stage. While these props are swept up every night, they are not permitted to be reused. What are the health and safety concerns that prevent the re-use of these kinds of props (such as snow, glitter, and petals)?

Some opera stories utilize weapons, which could become safety problems for performers. How might a props master create realistic-looking stage weapons that will not harm the performers? For example, Butterfly commits ritual suicide at the end of the opera. What does an audience need to see in order to understand what she's doing? How can this be safely staged? What kind of training is needed to choreograph a realistic fight scene?

In one of the opera's scenes, Cio-Cio-San has to kneel for a long period of time. What effect does prolonged kneeling have on a person's knees? What precautions can be taken to protect the performer's knees during this scene? How does a kneeling position impact breathing and a singer's ability to perform?

ES/MS

After being rejected and dishonored by Pinkerton, Butterfly sees ritual suicide as her only choice. How was ritual suicide, seppuku, viewed differently for men and women in Japan during the early 20<sup>th</sup> century? If Butterfly were rejected in the same way in the United States, what other options would our culture have afforded her?

Puccini was often photographed smoking a cigar. Were there any social stigmas attached to smoking in his lifetime? When did the view of smoking change? Did Puccini's smoking contribute to his fatal throat cancer?

At the end of the opera, Cio-Cio-San commits female ritual suicide, but Western viewers might interpret her actions as negative. What are the cultural differences between the Western concept of suicide and the Japanese concept of seppuku? What resources are available in your community to help people through the crisis that Cio-Cio-San faced?

As professional entertainers, geisha learn a variety of social skills, one of which is flower arranging. Why might people like to have flowers in their houses? What are your favorite flowers? What are some of the important elements in making a flower arrangement? Are there general rules to follow? Pretend you are Cio-Cio-San; make a flower arrangement to welcome home Pinkerton.

## **Character Themes for Madama Butterfly**

Eleanore N. Childs, a Pittsburgh attorney and child advocate, worked with teachers for more than a decade to research character education and develop the Heartwood Ethics Curriculum for Children. Heartwood's life lessons through literature promote understanding and practice of seven universal character attributes, which constitute the foundation of community among all people.

The Heartwood Institute defined seven universal character attributes:

- **Courage** is not only mastering fear; it is the ability to face difficulty or risk with integrity and honor.
- **Loyalty** is being faithful to a person, group, or ideal based on understanding that we are all part of something greater than ourselves.
- Justice is being guided by a balance of truth, reason, and fairness to all.
- **Respect** is regard for all life on earth. It calls us to value all people and their contributions, viewpoints, and differences, such as culture, religion, age, race, and ability.
- **Hope** guides our future through faith and aspiration, helping us to rise above selfishness and despair.
- Honesty is being truthful and honorable, the foundation for friendship and community.
- **Love** is deep care and concern for others, encompassing all the attributes. The more love we give, the richer we become.

Discuss two attributes—LOYALTY and LOVE—after reading the synopsis of *Madama Butterfly*.

- 1. What problems do both Cio-Cio-San and Suzuki face in the story? What do they do to solve their problems? How do they show loyalty to each other? How can you demonstrate loyalty to a friend?
- 2. Which characters in *Madama Butterfly* discuss loyalty? Was Cio-Cio-San loyal to her family and her religion? Was Pinkerton loyal to Butterfly? Brainstorm characters in the opera who truly demonstrate loyalty.
- 3. Who expresses love in *Madama Butterfly*? Does any character express deep care and concern for another character? How is that love expressed? How do you show love in your family?
- 4. Would the ending of *Madama Butterfly* have turned out differently if characters had shown loyalty and love? Would the opera have been as strong?
