Overview of Tosca

Set in Rome, and taking place over the course of 24 hours in June of 1800, Puccini's **Tosca** is the ultimate in opera melodrama.

Tosca combines political intrigue, love, loyalty, betrayal and murder with powerful music to create an unforgettably operatic experience.

We are thrilled to present Leah Crocetto in the title role of Tosca. Returning favorite Mark Delavan sings the role of Scarpia, one of the great villains in not just opera, but in the pantheon of Western storytelling.

Police chief Scarpia is hunting escaped political prisoner Cesare Angelotti. Angelotti is aided by artist Mario Cavaradossi, who is dating beautiful opera star Floria Tosca. Scarpia imprisons and tortures Cavaradossi to force Tosca to reveal Angelotti's hiding place, and has even more sadistic intentions as well. Will Tosca submit? Will Scarpia keep his end of the bargain? See for yourself why **Tosca** is one of the most powerful operas ever written.

Overview of The Marriage of Figaro

Mozart's **The Marriage of Figaro** is one of the most popular comic operas of all time. Filled with amusing cases of mistaken identity and romantic subterfuge, plus music by Mozart at the height of his powers, **The Marriage of Figaro** has stood the test of time for centuries.

Based on the play by Pierre Beaumarchais, **The Marriage of Figaro** is a sequel to **The Barber of Seville**, which we performed at the Benedum Center in 2016. The story opens several years later, in Count Almaviva's palace near Seville, Spain. Rosina is now the Countess; but her husband has lost much of his interest in her and is a would-be philanderer.

Figaro, the happy bachelor at the end of **The Barber of Seville**, is in love with the Countess's servant Susanna, who he plans to wed that very day. However, their employer Count Almaviva has his eye on Susanna. In fact, the Count intends to invoke the hated feudal practice of *droit de seigneur* - the infamous right of the lord to sleep with a commoner's bride on her wedding night.

Figaro, Susanna, and the Countess are understandably outraged at this possibility, and are determined not only to prevent it, but to teach the Count a lesson while they're at it.

Overview of The Long Walk

Pittsburgh Opera brings a gripping, contemporary American opera to the CAPA Theater in <u>Jeremy Howard Beck's</u> **The Long Walk**. With a libretto by <u>Stephanie Fleischmann</u>, **The Long Walk** is based on the book **The Long Walk**: A Story of War and the Life that **Follows** by <u>Brian Castner</u>.

The opera is a deeply personal exploration of a soldier's return from Iraq where he served as an officer in an Explosive Ordnance Disposal unit and his battle with what he calls "the Crazy" as he tries to reintegrate into his family life.

'The Long Walk' is the term for when a bomb disposal expert puts on their bomb suit and walks, alone, towards an Improvised Explosive Device (IED) which they must disarm. As Castner explains in an interview, "It is an extremely lonely experience; no one can help you." However, 'the long walk' also refers to the struggle to re-integrate back into your own life upon returning to the United States, a struggle which Castner shares with brutal honesty.

Commissioned by <u>American Lyric Theater</u> in 2012, the opera was developed under the auspices of the Composer Librettist Development Program, and premiered at <u>Opera Saratoga</u> in 2015. The <u>Times Union</u> called it "a daring operatic depiction of war's aftermath"; <u>another reviewer</u> said it "hits on all that makes us human".

Overview of Ashes & Snow

Pittsburgh Opera is proud to produce our second world premiere in two years. This time the work will be performed in the intimate environs of Pittsburgh Opera's historic headquarters in the Strip District.

Ashes & Snow, composed by <u>Douglas J. Cuomo</u>, is based on <u>Wilhelm Müller</u>'s 24 poem cycle used as the text for <u>Franz Schubert's</u> famous <u>Winterreise</u> ("Winter Journey").

The 24 poems and songs of the Winterreise tell an anguished story of lost love, through what is essentially a single dramatic monologue, sung here by Pittsburgh Opera Resident Artist tenor Eric Ferring.

Ashes & Snow is set in the present day, and unfolds in a run-down motel room in the desert of the American West. The protagonist must confront his demons and face up to everything he has done, and all he has lost, in his life. He is searching for forgiveness, enlightenment and atonement.

Musically, Mr. Ferring will be accompanied by three on-stage musicians, who will be playing an electric guitar, trumpet, and piano (keyboards), with electronic sound effects. The musical style is '21st century art-song', infused with acid jazz and punk energy, to create a very raw and emotional experience.

Composer Douglas J. Cuomo is perhaps most well-known for his opera <u>"Doubt"</u>, based on the play and movie of the same name, which premiered at <u>Minnesota Opera</u> in 2013.

After its world premiere at Pittsburgh Opera, **Ashes & Snow** will be performed at the prestigious <u>Brooklyn Academy of Music</u> (BAM) in autumn 2018.

Ashes & Snow is being developed in partnership with <u>American Opera Projects</u> (AOP). AOP is at the forefront of the contemporary opera movement, commissioning, developing, presenting, and producing opera and music theatre projects, collaborating with young, rising, and established artists. This will be the fourth Pittsburgh Opera project involving



AOP, and the third in the past two years. AOP developed **Paul's Case** and co-produced its 2013 premiere, produced the world premiere of **As One**, which Pittsburgh Opera is performing in February, 2017, and developed **The Summer King**, which made its world premiere at the Benedum Center in April, 2017.

Overview of The Elixir of Love

We will conclude our 2017-18 season with Donizetti's **L'elisir d'amore** - **The Elixir Of Love**, a comedy about a traveling medicine show huckster who claims to possess a love potion.

People have pinned their romantic hopes on magic love potions for thousands of years. Why, the very name 'aphrodisiac' comes from the Greek goddess of love, Aphrodite. And whether it's *Love Potion Number 9* or the *Funky Cold Medina*, people have been singing about love potions for a long time too.

The story concerns a "little nobody" named Nemorino. Nemorino is smitten with the beautiful and wealthy Adina, who appears to be completely out of his league. His prospects are further diminished when the handsome and dashing Sergeant Belcore arrives. But when Doctor Dulcamara rolls into town and sells Nemorino a bottle of his dubious Elixir of Love, things get very interesting.

Not seen here since 2007, **The Elixir of Love** is full of charming romance and light-hearted fun.

Pittsburgh Opera's annual Student Matinee will introduce 2,000+ school children grades 3-12 to this lively, colorful opera on Thursday, April 26th, 2018 at the Benedum Center. The Resident Artists take lead roles in the Student Matinee, and are accompanied by the Pittsburgh Opera Orchestra, in yet another opportunity to hone performance skills.
